

Legendary Jockey Pat Day to Sign Limited Number of Triple Crown Glasses

Hall of Fame jockey, Pat Day, who won the 1992 Kentucky Derby, 1994, 1995 and 1996 Preakness and 1994 Belmont, will be signing the official glasses from these years on Saturday, Nov. 21 from 11:30 a.m.-1:30 p.m. at the Churchill Downs Store.

Day will sign the glasses and items purchased in the store for donations to support The Backside Learning Center and Christ Chapel. The edition is limited to 200 sets. The Preakness and Belmont glasses have the Jockeys Guild Boot on the bottom.

The Kentucky Derby glasses, which do not have the boot on the bottom, are also signed by Lynn Whiting, who trained the 1992 Kentucky Derby winning horse. The initials for The Backside Learning Center and Christ Chapel (BLC/CC) will also be on the glasses to distinguish them as a special limited edition.

During the special event, Day will sign a limited number of 1992 Kentucky Derby glasses for a minimum donation of \$30 per glass.

Day won the 1992 Kentucky Derby aboard Lil E. Tee. A select number of 1994, 1995 and 1996 Preakness glasses and 1994 Belmont glasses will also be available for a minimum donation of \$20 per glass. A limited number of five glass sets will be available for a minimum donation of \$100. Other items purchased in the store can also be signed for a donation of \$10 for each signature.

The Churchill Downs Store is located at Churchill Downs Racetrack inside admission gate 17. The store is run by the Kentucky Derby Museum and all proceeds from items purchased in the store support the preservation of Kentucky Derby History and its mission to share the fun of the Kentucky Derby.
